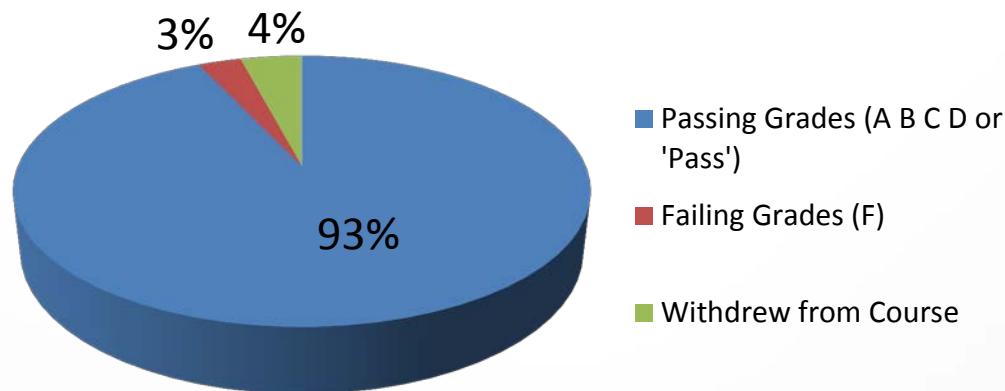

Program Overview

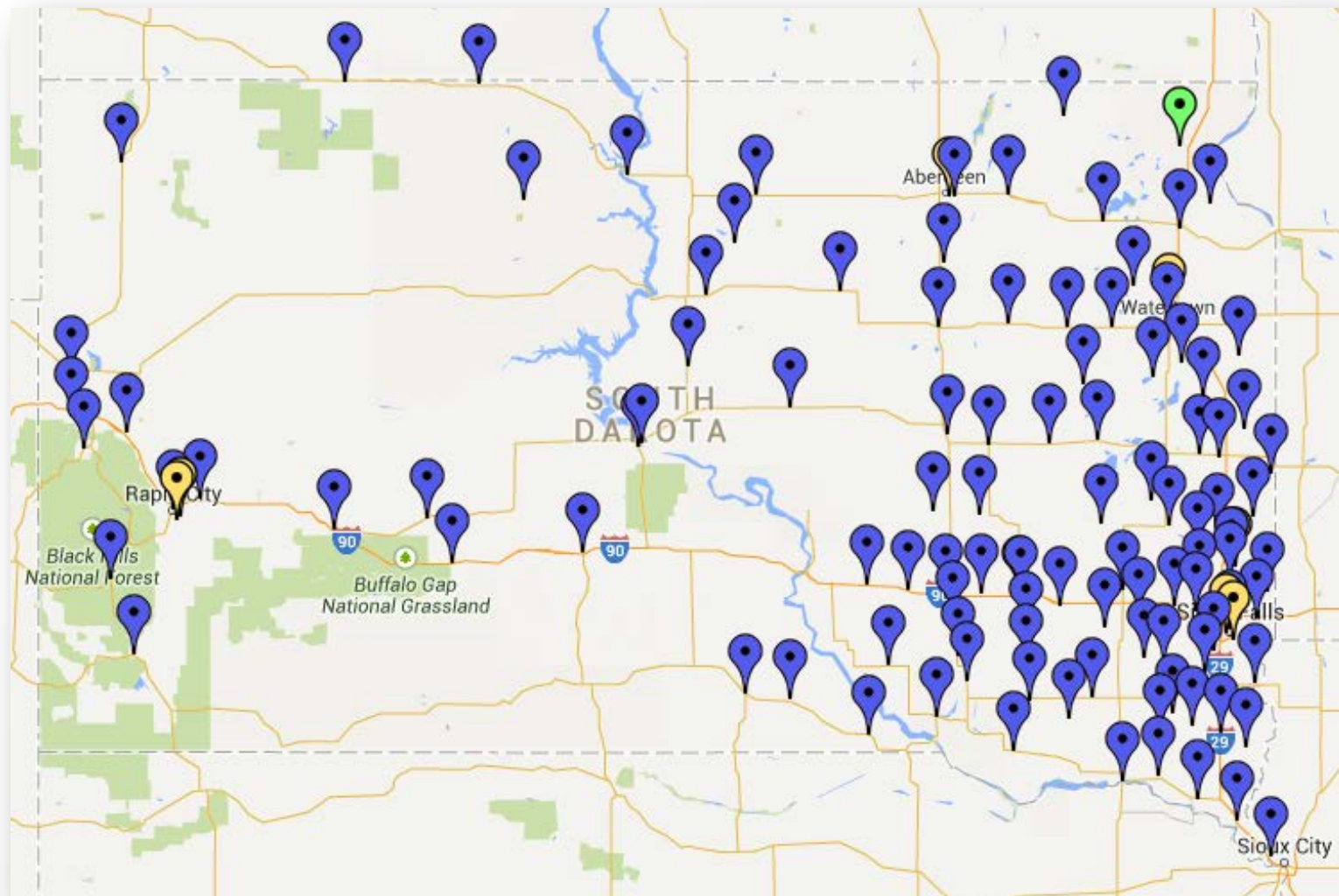
- College-level coursework taken by 11th and 12th graders
- Online and in-person courses
 - General Education
 - Technical
- Began with Fall 2014 enrollment
- State funding used to lessen the cost for students
 - Student: \$40 per credit + course expenses
 - State: \$105 per credit

Fall 2014 Participation

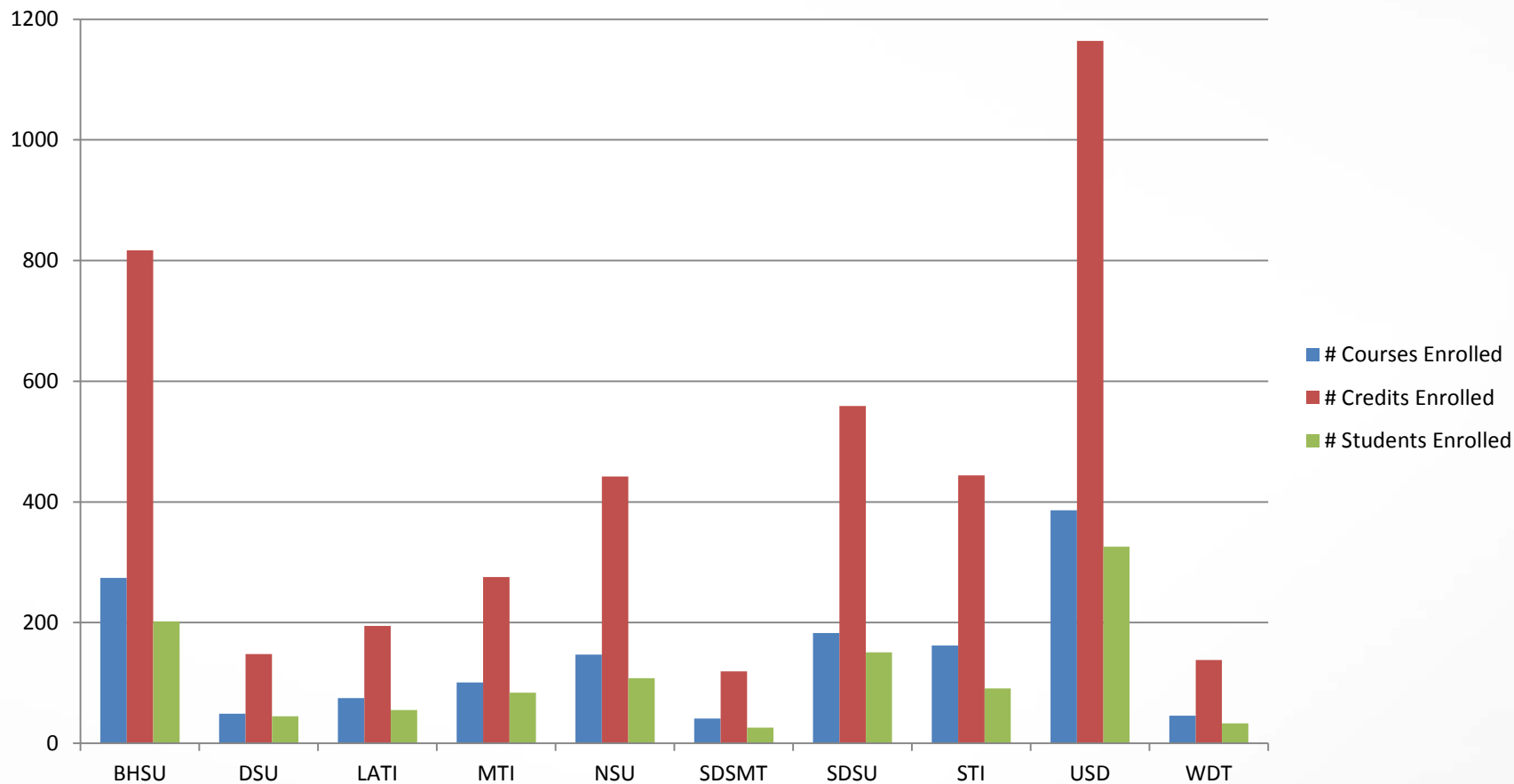
- 1,077 11th and 12th graders
 - 20% Juniors, 80% Seniors
 - 34% Male, 66% Female
- 3,980 credits completed with a passing grade
 - 3.7 credits completed per student, average
 - 93% pass rate



Fall 2014 Participation

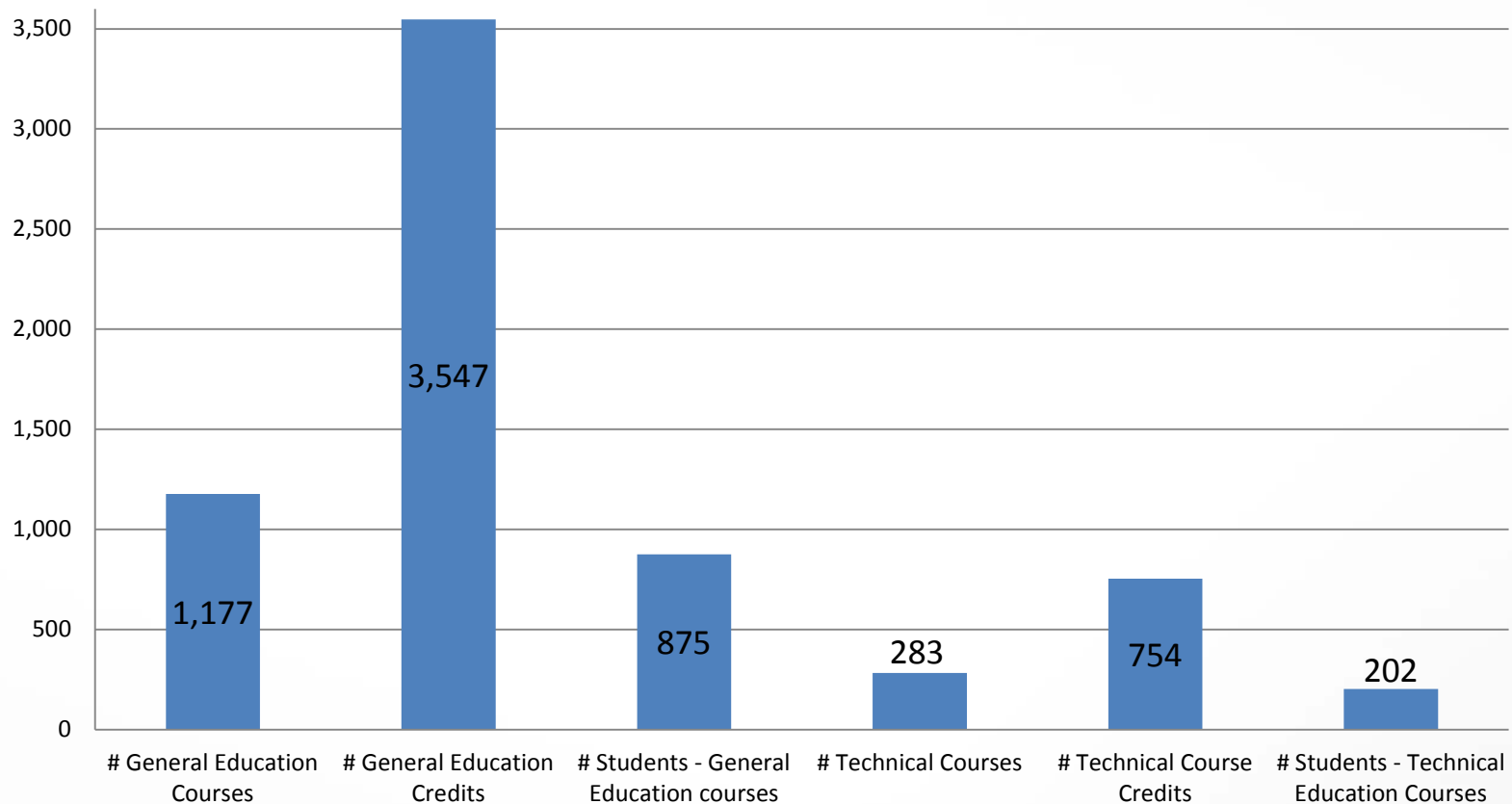


Fall 2014 Enrollment

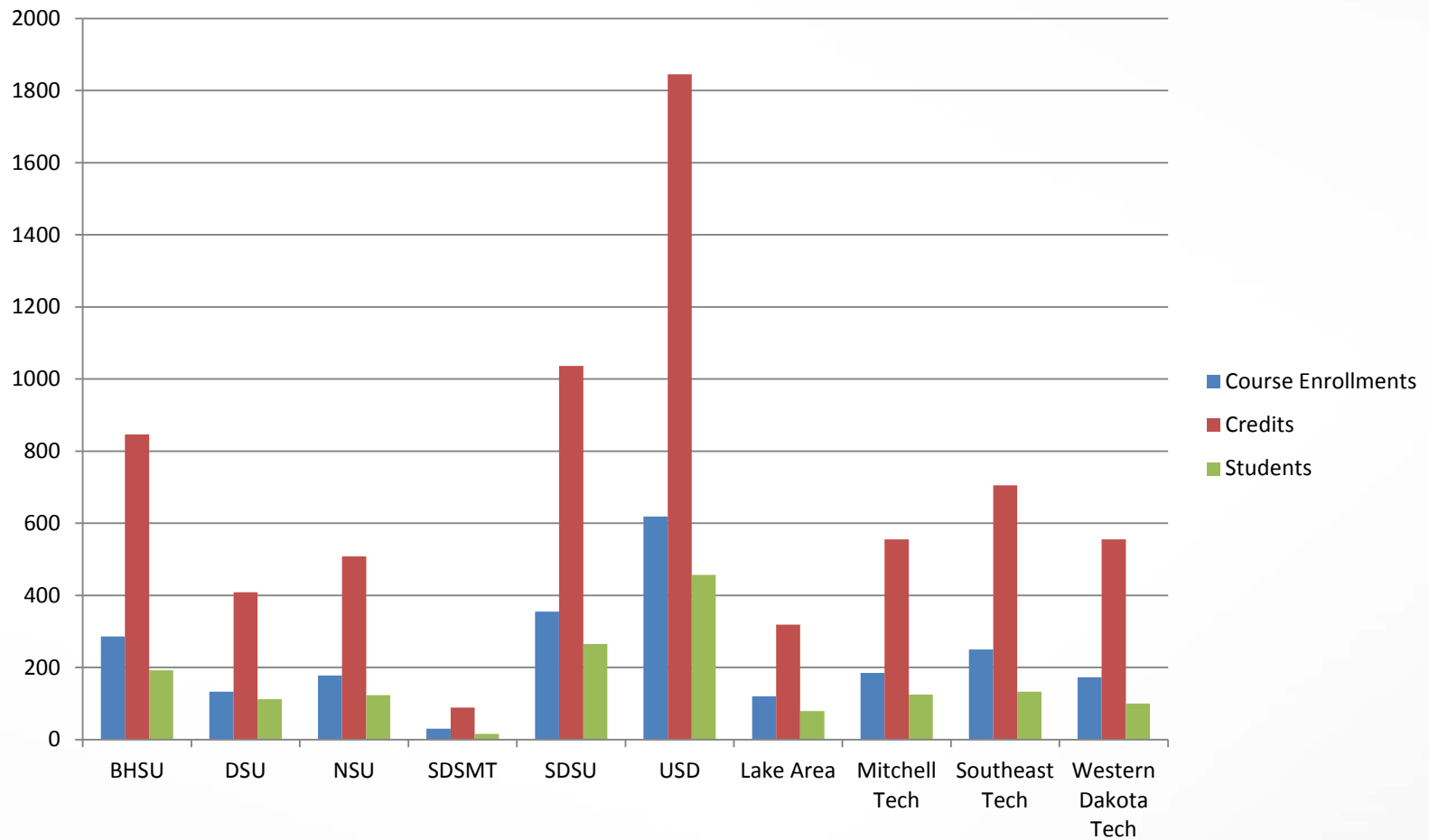


Fall 2014 Enrollment

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DUAL CREDIT

Dual credit is an opportunity for high school students who meet admissions standards to enroll in postsecondary institutions in South Dakota and simultaneously earn credits for both their high school diploma and postsecondary degree or certificate.

Students can earn dual credit by directly enrolling into a postsecondary institution's coursework. These courses are offered by the postsecondary institution's faculty members, are governed by the postsecondary institution's policies, and follow the postsecondary institution's established processes for admissions, registration, billing and grade reporting.

Through a new program approved by the South Dakota Legislature, dual credit coursework is available to high school students in grades 11-12 at the rate of \$40 per credit. That compares to about \$200 per credit at the state's four technical institutes and \$300 per credit at the state's public universities. Students are responsible for the \$40-per-credit cost and any required textbooks or related course materials.
